The mission of Buttonwood Nature Center is to guide the people of the Cumberland Valley region to become stewards of their natural and cultural worlds. We do this by providing experiential learning in authentic settings for people of all ages. We've historically recorded approximately 8,000 student visits annually to our school program series. Our community learning series engages people of all ages with a speaker series, field excursions and workshops. Engaging people in outdoor learning and recreation is known to provide benefits beyond the immediate lesson or activity. Buttonwood experiences invite opportunities for social connectedness, movement in the outdoors, and ignite curiosity and learning. Benefits for participating community members include not only the recreational and educational value of the experience, but also improved physical and emotional wellbeing and enhanced quality of life. Outdoor education serves as a foundation for raising the next generation of citizens who will care for their natural and human communities.
